### WHERE IS HOLLAND COLLEGE?

Holland College is located in Prince Edward Island, Canada. Prince Edward Island is located off the eastern coast of Canada, close to New Brunswick and Nova Scotia. The Island is known for the vivid colors of its gently rolling landscape and is surrounded by miles of sandy beaches and red sandstone cliffs. The Island is sized just right for touring, vacationing and studying!

### HOW DO I GET TO HOLLAND COLLEGE?

You can get to Holland College in Prince Edward Island by driving, by rail (with connecting bus service), and by air. Air Canada, Air Canada Jazz, WestJet, and Prince Edward Air all provide service into the Charlottetown Airport which is located just minutes away from the capital city of Charlottetown.

### HOW DO I APPLY?

Detailed application information is available on the website at [www.hollandcollege.com/admissions/](http://www.hollandcollege.com/admissions/). **You can apply online!** Application forms can also be downloaded from the website. You can fax, mail, or e-mail the completed application form. The non-refundable application fee for international students is \$100.00 (Canadian funds) and is required when you submit your application. Your application will not be processed without this payment.

Here are a few options for submitting your application and non-refundable application fee of \$100.00 (Canadian funds):

- You can fax your application, required documents, credit card number, expiration date and name on credit card to the Admissions Office at 1-902-629-4239.
- You can e-mail the application and required documents to [international@hollandcollege.com](mailto:international@hollandcollege.com) then call in your credit card information to pay your application fee at (902) 629-4217 (Admissions Office).
- You can send your application by e-mail or mail then pay the application fee by direct bank-to-bank transfer. If you would like more information about this option, please e-mail [international@hollandcollege.com](mailto:international@hollandcollege.com).

The Admissions Department is the department at Holland College that receives your application, scores your application and selects the candidates for entry into a program. Candidates are selected based on their overall application score. Once the Admissions Department has received your application, you will receive a confirmation e-mail of receipt. You will also be provided with a user ID and password to monitor the status of your application. You will be notified by mail in due course regarding the status of your application.

You do not have to go through the application process alone; the International Office is here to help you. If you have any questions about your application, make sure you get the correct answers from the International Office.

#### **WHAT ARE THE ENGLISH REQUIREMENTS?**

Because English is the language of study at Holland College, all applicants whose first language is not English must provide proof of English proficiency. This requirement can be satisfied with one of the following criteria:

1. You have studied full-time for at least three years (or equivalent in part-time studies) in a secondary school or university where the language of instruction and examination was English. If this applies to you, please provide verification from your school that the language of instruction and examination was English. (Note: The minimum three year requirement does not include time enrolled in an ESL program.)
2. You have achieved the required proficiency in one of the following English language tests:
  - TOEFL manual score of 550
  - TOEFL computerized score of 225
  - TOEFL – internet based minimum 85
  - Successful completion of ESL Level 8
  - IELTS score of 6.0
  - CAEL (Canadian Academic English Language) minimum score of 60 with minimum score of 50 in each band
  - CanTEST with minimum score of 4.5
  - MELAB (Michigan English Language Battery) minimum score of 80

#### **WHAT ARE SUPPORT DOCUMENTS?**

Support documents are items that you would send in as a supplement to your application. In some cases you are required to have additional documents with your application such as: standard first-aid certificate or medical forms. Examples of support documents include: resume, letters of reference, cover letter, copies of certifications, transcripts, eye examinations, documented volunteer hours, medical

forms, etc. If you get accepted to your program and have not sent the required documents, your letter of acceptance will tell you what is missing from your file. If your application has not yet been processed due to missing documents, you will receive an e-mail from the Registrar's Office requesting the documents needed. Please make sure you check your program of interest on the website under 'full-time programs' for a listing of required support documents.

### **CAN I APPLY ONLINE NOW AND SEND IN MY SUPPORT DOCUMENTS LATER?**

You certainly can. While it is absolutely fine to send documents later, the sooner the better. The Admissions Department must have your high school transcript and any post-secondary transcripts (if applicable) to determine a score for your application.

### **WHEN CAN I APPLY?**

**You can apply now!** The initial application review date is February 28<sup>th</sup> for all programs beginning the following September. You have the best chance of getting in the program if you apply before February 28<sup>th</sup>. We will still accept applications after that date and you can still get into September programs providing they do not fill after our initial review.

### **CAN I GET A LOAN TO PAY FOR MY TUITION?**

You must apply through your home country's loan system, if one is available. Unfortunately, Holland College does not have any role in providing student loans to international students. For American applicants, Holland College is approved with the US Federal Aid and Sallie Mae Loans as an eligible foreign school. Our school code is G34203.

### **WHAT IS THE COST OF HOLLAND COLLEGE PROGRAMS?**

Tuition costs vary depending upon the program and duration. Tuition for full-time programs range from \$3,500 to \$6,500 per year. All Canadian universities and colleges charge an international student differential fee. At Holland College, this fee is \$3,465 per year. ### **WHAT PERMITS DO I NEED TO STUDY AT HOLLAND COLLEGE?**

### **CAN I WORK WHILE ATTENDING HOLLAND COLLEGE?**

**WHAT INSURANCE DO I NEED?**

All international students must purchase medical insurance for the duration of their study in Canada. Insurance is included in the tuition and fees.
